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COVID-19 Related District wide Response Practices Updated August 17, 2022

On August 17, 2022, the Board of Education for the Ashwaubenon School District are utilizing the following COVID-19 related practices for the 2022-23 school year that will cease, continue, and/or begin:

- The District will cease:
 - Contact tracing;
 - Quarantining for close contacts;
 - Providing online instruction for students that are absent;
 - o Operating a COVID-19 dashboard;
 - Requesting information regarding student symptoms when parents call their child in due to illness:
 - Requiring social distancing and social distancing reminder signage within our school facilities.
- The District will continue the following practices:
 - Maintaining a list of positive cases for local health department review;
 - Requiring a 5-day quarantine when student, faculty or staff member is COVID-19 positive, followed by recommending a 5-day (not required) masking period if attending school during days 6-10 of the active case period.
- The District will begin:
 - o Relying upon parental communication for at-home COVID-19 test results;
 - Referring parents to the <u>Brown County Health Department</u> or the <u>Wisconsin</u> <u>Department of Health Services</u> websites for information regarding COVID-19 symptoms, as well as to our <u>Common Communicable/Contagious Disease Guidelines</u> document.
- The District makes the following recommendation (not requirement) for families and faculty/staff members:
 - o In concert with the Wisconsin Department of Health Services and regardless of our community's COVID-19 level, the wearing of a well-fitting mask around others remains an effective mitigation strategy and can provide added support for our community in responding to the challenges presented by the COVID-19 pandemic if we have:
 - Recently been exposed to someone with COVID-19,
 - Are symptomatic for COVID-19,
 - Test positive for COVID-19.
