H. Superintendent's Report

- <u>ASD Referendum:</u> Thank you to our amazing community for once again supporting our students, staff, and school district in our operational referendum last week. 63% of our community voted in support of an operational referendum
- AHS Musical: The fall 2024 AHS Musical, The Drowsy Chaperone, starts Friday, November 22nd. The show runs November 23, 29, 20, 30 and December 1st. Tickets can be purchased through Ticketstar site.
- Fall Sport All Conference and State Honors and Student Activities: Weyers provided an update on All Conference, Academic All State and State Honors in Girls Golf, Football, Cross Country, Girl Tennis, Boys Soccer, Girls Volleyball, Girls Swim. This fall, 5 student-athletes participated in the local Feed My Starving Children set-up and 50 student council and student-athletes read to Pioneer and Valley View students.
- **Jaguar Excellence Awards:** In the month of October, Weyers handed out 85 Jaguar Excellence Awards to staff. This brings the total to nearly 300 in the first two months.
- <u>Letter of Intents</u>: On November 13th, Thea Kral (track and field) and Berritt Herr (softball) signed their letter of intents to UW-Madison. Congratulations Thea and Berritt

I. Discussion Items:

- 1. Elementary Continuous Improvement Plan Updates: Cormier, Pioneer and Valley View Administrators reviewed their 23-24 goals and shared their 2024-25 goals and action steps. They shared where they are with their goals, what is working well and what needs additional focus. Andy Bake spoke about the district's work on its strategic plan and goals. He explained the process around determining which guaranteed standards the district/schools select to focus on. Bake shared the steps/process of moving the district toward Standards Based Grading. The board asked Bake to talk about how the district/teachers/students are adjusting to the new literacy curriculum.
- **2. Bylaw 0164 Update first read:** Kurt Weyers stated Jennifer is working on new set of policy/bylaw updates coming in December. With the upcoming interviews being planned for the superintendent position, by law 0164 was pulled from the upcoming revisions for the for board review and approve before interviews start in January 2025. This is a first read and will be brought back to the board for a second read and approval in December. No changes were recommended.

J. Action Items:

- 1. <u>Designation of Election Clerk</u>: Brian VanDeKreeke recommended the designation of Jennifer Bower as elections' clerk for the 2025 elections. Moved by VanDeKreeke, seconded by Anderson to approve designation of Jennifer Bower as the election clerk as presented. Aye 5 (Vyskocil, Garrigan, VandeWalle, Anderson, VanDeKreeke), Nay 0. Motion carried 5:0
- **2. Spanish Trip 2026:** Dirk Ribbens presented the Spanish Trip to Colombia during the summer of 2026. The trip is sponsored by the Spanish Department and is being planned for June 16-26, 2026. Per student cost is \$3,924. Student will be fundraising to help cover the cost of the trip. Moved by Anderson, seconded by VandeWalle to approve the 2026 Spanish Trip to Colombia as presented. Aye 5 (Vyskocil, Garrigan, VandeWalle, Anderson, VanDeKreeke), Nay 0. Motion carried 5:0
- 3. Local Control Budget Carryover: Keith Lucius presented the local control budget carryover for each building. He reminded that board that allowing administrators to carry this money over enables them to purchase large equipment for their buildings. Lucius recommended a total Local Control Budget Carryover of \$130,132. The board asked each principal to talk about how they would be using the money. Upcoming purchased will include lunchroom/cafeteria tables and student desks, tables and chairs. Moved by Garrigan, seconded by VanDeKreeke to approve the local control budget carryover of \$130,132 as presented. Aye 5 (Vyskocil, Garrigan, VandeWalle, Anderson, VanDeKreeke), Nay 0. Motion carried 5:0

- Weyers stated he received a number of emails and calls from the community congratulating the district
 on the referendum results. Weyers thanked everyone involved in the work around the referendum and
 the board for continuing to stand by the promise it made. The overall conversations have been positive.
- Brian VanDeKreeke spoke about the conversation he had with a community member and sharing the
 information on the flyer with them. Brian Anderson spoke about sharing the flyer information with the
 community during trick or treating.

Explanation:	<u>Policy 0174.1 - Annual Report</u> - This revision adds a reference to the authorization for the performance of clerk duties and the legal citation for same. Adoption of this revision is recommended for clarity and flexibility.
	Policy 2131 - Educational Outcome Goals and Expectations - This policy is updated to include the additional language added by 2023 Wisconsin Act 266, which amends Wis. Stat. 118.01(2)(c)8. to include reference to Hmong Americans and Asian Americans. Adoption of this revision is recommended to have compliant policies.
	<u>Policy 2340 - District-Sponsored Trips - The transportation policy language</u> from Policy 8640 - Transportation for Field and Other District-Sponsored Trips has been added to this policy, and Policy 8640 has been rescinded. Adoption of this revision is recommended to maintain consistency across the pertinent policies.
	Policy 8640 - Transportation for Field and Other District-Sponsored Trips - This policy has been rescinded. The content of this policy has been moved to Policy 2340 - District-Sponsored Trips. Adoption of this update is strongly recommended to assure consistency with other pertinent policies, which are included in this update as well.
	Policy 3120.08 - Employment of Personnel for Co-Curricular/Extra-Curricular Activities - This revision cleans up the language to be in line with current practice. Policy 4120.04 - Employment of Substitutes - These revisions are recommended for a more comprehensive policy consistent with current demands.
	Policy 5330 - Administration of Medication/Emergency Care - This policy is revised to include the option of a student receiving nonprescription drugs that are provided by the school consistent from the schools' supplies, with parental instructions, dosage instructions, or health care provider instructions. Adoption of this revision is recommended to maintain compliant policies.

<u>Policy 5430 - Class Rank</u> - This policy is updated to incorporate the class ranking requirements for students to participate in the University of Wisconsin System's Guaranteed Admission Program.

Policy 5460 - Graduation Requirements - This policy is revised to reference the newly enacted .5 credit requirement in financial literacy for high school graduation. Adoption of this revision is required as part of the board's responsibility to adopt the curriculum.

Policy 5505 - Academic Honesty - This policy is revised to incorporate concerns regarding emerging AI technology and its impact on academic integrity. Additionally, this policy is updated to include optional language regarding the use of Artificial Intelligence by students in the completion of their school work. Adoption of this language, or a similar version of the language that identifies use of AI tools to create work as a form of academic dishonesty, except when authorized, is strongly recommended.

<u>Policy 5610 - Suspension and Expulsion</u> - The policy is revised to include language for the Board to express preference for exclusionary discipline. Consideration of these revisions is recommended.

Policy 5610.03 - Alternatives to Expulsion and Reentry Plans (New) - This new policy is offered to address the common practice of providing students with an opportunity to avoid the expulsion hearing process in circumstances where administration determines it is appropriate to offer an abeyance plan with conditions designed to correct the behavior. This is a voluntary process that requires the student and parent of a minor student to agree to a set of conditions which, if adhered to, avoid the student's referral to the Board for possible expulsion. Consideration of this policy is recommended, but is not required.

Policy 5771 - Search and Seizure - This policy is revised to make it easier to follow and to specifically note that a student search may be directed by an administrator other than the principal. Adoption of this revision is recommended.

<u>Policy 6423 - Use of Credit Cards</u> - This policy is revised to provide more specific restrictions on district credit card usage and personal use of any credit card rewards program. Adoption of this revision is recommended.

<u>Policy 7450 - Property Inventory</u> - This policy is updated to reflect the current equipment replacement cost from \$100 to \$5,000. Revisions are recommended to be current with legal limits.

Policy 7540.05 - Assistive Technology and Services - This policy is updated to address new technology being used with certain students as a way to communicate with them and to monitor their location and behavior, At this time, the primary concern is the communication component, particularly as it relates to communication from the device to a parent or other location outside the school. This presents concerns for other student confidentiality. The policy update reflects the expectation that such functionality will be disabled during school, unless expressly provided for in the student's IEP. Adoption of this update is strongly recommended.

<u>Policy 8500 - Food Services</u> - This policy is updated to streamline the dietary accommodations language. Also added is a required grievance procedure related to the disability-related dietary accommodations process. A grievance procedure is required by Federal regulation (7 C.F.R. 15b.6). Adoption is strongly recommended.

<u>Policy 8531 - Free and Reduced-Price Meals</u> - The policy is updated to incorporate additional federal regulatory requirements regarding student participation in the free and reduced meal program Consideration of this update is recommended.

<u>Policy 8540 - Vending Machines</u> - This policy is updated to include the Department of Agriculture's required nondiscrimination statement. Adoption of this update is strongly recommended.

<u>Policy 8550 - Competitive Food Sales</u> - This policy is updated to include the Department of Agriculture's required nondiscrimination statement. Adoption of this update is strongly recommended.

<u>Policy 8600 - Transportation</u> - This policy has been updated by adding language previously in Policy 8680 - Transportation Services Contracts. Adoption of this update is strongly recommended.

<u>Policy 8680 - Transportation Services Contracts</u> - The policy is revised to remove reference to transportation using School District-owned vehicles. This policy is intended to cover transportation through contracts with a transportation provider. The provisions regarding District-owned or operated vehicles haves been moved to Policy 8600 - Transportation. Adoption of this update is strongly recommended.

Policy 8660 - Transportation by Private Vehicle for District-Sponsored Activities or Trips - This policy is updated to provide additional options to better control private transportation for field trips given that the need to do so continues to increase in frequency. Consideration of options provided is recommended.

0164 - **MEETINGS**

Regular Meetings

The Board shall hold a meeting at least once each month on a date and at a time and place determined annually by a resolution of the Board.

Change of Regular Meetings

If the Board adopts a resolution changing changes the date, time, or place of a regularly scheduled meeting, the meeting notice shall state the date, time, place, and subject matter of the rescheduled meeting, as well as the name and address of the District. Said notice shall be posted on the front door of the Administrative Office Building and at such places as the Board may determine. Meeting notices of scheduled Board meetings shall be posted in accordance with State law. (See also Policy 0166 - Agenda)

Special Meetings

A special meeting of the Board shall be held upon the written request of any Board member provided there is compliance with the following notice provisions and State law.

The School District Clerk or, in the School District Clerk's absence, the President shall fix a reasonable date, time, and place for the meeting. The School District Clerk or, in the School District Clerk's absence, the President shall notify each Board member of the date, time, and place of the meeting, in a manner likely to give the Board member notice of the meeting, at least twenty-four (24) hours before the meeting. If the School District Clerk or, in the School District Clerk's absence, the President determines that providing notice at least twenty-four (24) hours before a special Board meeting is, for good cause, shown by the School District Clerk or President, impossible or impractical, the School District Clerk or President may notify each Board member of the date, time, and place of the meeting less than twenty-four (24) hours, but not less than two (2) hours, before the meeting. A notice of any special meeting shall be posted at least twenty-four (24) hours before said special meeting at the District office and such other places as the Board may determine unless, for good cause, such notice is impossible or impracticable, but in no case may the notice be less than two (2) hours in advance of the meeting.

A special meeting may be held without prior notice if all Board members are present and consent, or if each member consents in writing even if the Board member does not attend, provided appropriate notice is provided as defined under Chapter 19.

Notice of Meetings

Public notice of all Board meetings shall be given pursuant to statute. Such notice shall be given, without cost, to any news media which submits a written request for meeting notices and to a news medium likely to give notice in the District's geographic area. In addition, such notice shall be made public in at least one (1) of the following ways:

- A. posting the notice in at least three (3) public places likely to give notice to persons affected;
- B. posting the notice in at least one (1) public place likely to give notice to persons affected and on the governmental body's website; or

C. by paid publication in a news medium likely to give notice to persons affected.

The notice shall be given, without cost, to the District's official newspaper, the Press Times.

The notice shall list the date, time, place, and subject matter of each regularly scheduled meeting of the Board, including subjects intended for the consideration at any closed session, in the form which is reasonably likely to inform members of the public and the news media. To assure that notice of a meeting is specific enough to apprise the public of the purpose of the meeting, the following factors shall be considered: 1) the time and effort required to provide detailed notice; 2) the level of public interest in the particular subject; and 3) whether the meeting will involve routine or novel issues. The notice shall contain the name and address of the District and its telephone number. The notice shall be given at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the meeting unless for good cause such notice is impossible or impractical, but in no case may the notice be less than two (2) hours in advance of the meeting. The notice shall also contain the following statement:

"If special accommodations are necessary for you to participate in this meeting, please contact the Director of Pupil Services at 492-2905, ext. 1010 at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the meeting."

Cancellation of Meetings

If a regularly scheduled and legally noticed meeting needs to be canceled (e.g., inclement weather, electrical outage, broken water pipe, lack of quorum, etc.), the Board President or designee shall have the authority to cancel or reschedule the meeting. To the extent practical, a notice of cancellation should be provided, similar to the notice of the meeting.

Virtual Participation in Meetings

Unless-Generally, the Board does not allow virtual participation, unless otherwise determined by the Board President or due to an order by an authorized authority preventing in-person attendance at a meeting.7 Board members are expected to attend meetings in person at the location set by the Board for the meeting. A Board member may attend virtually in instances where a member is unable to attend in person due to a scheduled absence from the District or due to an illness or a physical restriction preventing attendance. The Board member is responsible for making advance arrangements with the District administration to facilitate participation in the meeting. Remote access during quasi-judicial functions (e.g., termination hearings, expulsions) may be permitted after consultation with legal counsel.

A Board member may only attend closed session portions of meetings virtually provided in person unless the Board member verbally represents that they are alone and their physical location is secure from any third parties overhearing the proceedings in closed session. Remote access during quasi-judicial functions (e.g., termination hearings, expulsions) may be permitted after consultation with legal counsel.

Any Board member attending a meeting remotely may vote in accordance with Bylaw 0167.1 - Voting.

Any Board member attending a meeting or who intended to attend a meeting remotely but is unable to attend or unable to maintain attendance due to technological complications, such as a poor connection or other equipment failures, will be considered absent for all or part of the meeting. The meeting may continue in the member's absence provided that a quorum is still present.
