ASHWAUBENON HIGH SCHOOL

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LOCATION

The Village of Ashwaubenon is a suburb of Green Bay, located in the "shadow of Lambeau Field", with a population of approximately 18,000. Since its beginning over 100 years ago as an agricultural community, Ashwaubenon has grown into an excellent area for residential living and learning, and as an industrial and commercial center for the Green Bay area. Many residents have chosen to move to Ashwaubenon specifically for the quality of the schools.

ASHWAUBENON HIGH SCHOOL

Ashwaubenon High School was established in 1965 as a comprehensive high school, offering a diversified curriculum designed to meet the needs of all learners. Since then, AHS has become a leader in education and is well recognized throughout the state for the quality of instructional and cocurricular programs, along with the post-secondary success of graduates. Known for innovations in instructional programs and technology, Ashwaubenon is a highly desirable district in the area and continues to draw many out-of-district students electing to enroll through Wisconsin's Public School Open Enrollment Program. Approximately 1,000 students are enrolled at Ashwaubenon High School.

CURRICULUM

Ashwaubenon High School utilizes the 4x4 block schedule. In this scheduling model courses are one or two terms in length. One term courses meet for 45 days and are worth one-half credit. Two term courses are 90 days in length and are worth one credit. All students take four classes per term, for a total of eight credits each academic year.

In 2010-2011, a modified block schedule option for band, chorus, and other selected courses was introduced. Each of these courses became a half-block earning either one-half credit for two terms or one credit for four terms.
