COMMUNITY CONVERSATIONS & STRATEGIC PLAN UPDATE

Following our Community Conversations sessions that took place this past March, the District has taken the input and feedback from participants and has been working on developing our Strategic Plan. We are excited to share with you our new Vision, Mission Statement, Core Values, and Pillars. As we continue to collaborate and work on our Strategic Plan, yearly goals and action steps will be developed. Once again, thank you to all of those who took part in the Community Conversations and took an active role in shaping the future of the Ashwaubenon School District.

HYDROPONIC GARDENS

This spring, the Ashwaubenon School Nutrition Department, with the help of the Facilities Department, installed a brand not hydroponic garden area in the High School. The new garden spring consists of 21 hydroponic units which will supply students with greens, cucumbers, peppers, fresh herbs and more during the year.

The district is not new to hydroponic farming. The addition of garden space brought our total to 34 hydroponic units through the five schools: one unit in the Cormier cafeteria, two in the View cafeteria, two in the Pioneer cafeteria, two in the Parkvic cafeteria, and three in the High School cafeteria. Twenty-one care in the hydroponic farming area - 12 growing lettuce, 6 growing vegetables, and 3 stand-alone units - with an addition three units in one of the science classrooms. ASD holds the laindoor, K-12 hydroponic garden in the US.

Starting September 2023, two AHS classes will maintain the negarden area at the high school. We are excited to be able to eleon this positive learning experience for all students, grades K-while providing quality, organic, and hyper-local produce to obstudents. Each hydroponic unit will produce 20-25 lbs of leafy every 4 weeks. Our goal as a School Nutrition Department is to never have to purchase lettuce outside of our district again. We constantly striving to provide healthier, locally grown food for students!
