The scheduling window to set up conferences will open will open

Monday, February 19th at noon and will remain open until Monday, March 4th at 6:00 p.m. *As a reminder, once the scheduling window closes, the office will not be able to schedule conferences for you.* If you want to meet with your student's teacher and the scheduling window has already closed, you will need to email each teacher you wish to conference with and set up a time outside of the school day to meet. Please, be prompt in scheduling your conferences so that you and your student can discuss with teachers how their school year is going.

Also, if you would rather conference with teachers in-person, there will be that option to choose when scheduling conferences.

Please remember to include your student in these conferences. By involving them, it gives them a voice in their education.

A detailed letter will be sent out on Friday, February 16th, explaining how to schedule conferences. Please keep an eye out for that information.



IMPORTANT PICK-UP & DROP OFF REMINDERS!

February 2nd, 2024

We have had many near accidents in front of school while picking up and dropping off in front of school so this communication is to again review student drop-off and pick up procedures in front of Parkview. Our top priority is student safety, which begins with drop-off each morning. We have had a number of instances where vehicles could not enter our parking spots at the end of the day to pick up their students early due to the line of cars in front of our building. Below are details along with the information included in the Parent/Student Handbook for 2023-2024. Alternate and recommended drop off and pick up locations include the Community Center and Target parking lots.

Updated Information:

and after school.

- During student drop off in the morning, all vehicles should pull up to the Parkview digital sign (see green area on included map) or as far as possible without stopping. Drop offs should not occur on the curved part of the driveway where the orange cones are currently located (see red areas on included map). If the line is backed up to this area, please have your student remain in the vehicle until you are able to pull forward to the sign or past the parking spots located in front of school. These efforts are in order to keep the traffic moving as much as possible and avoid congestion at the entrance of the driveway.
- Students should ONLY exit on the right side of the vehicle when being dropped off in front of Parkview. Because the left lane is a passing lane, it is unsafe for students to exit on this side of a vehicle. Our goal is to keep all students safe while also avoiding any kind of accidents in the front drive.
- The left passing lane will remain blocked at the entrance to the front drive. This lane is accessible after dropping your student off in the right lane. PLEASE, DO NOT STOP IN THE LEFT LANE TO LET YOUR STUDENT OUT OF THE CAR. The left lane is a passing lane only.
- Please ask your student to be ready to unbuckle and get out in an efficient manner so that the line may keep moving.

<u>Parent/Student Handbook Drop Off and Pick Up Procedures</u>: The following procedures were established to help ensure the safety of all Parkview students, parents and staff. Everyone's cooperation will help make it a safe year for all our children.

For the safety of our students, please obey all the signage around our school as it is posted. **Please do not stop in the left traffic lane in front of the school**, as this is the pull out lane for parents after they drop off their son or daughter.

The parking lot at the WEST end of the school is only for our buses to enter and leave. Vehicles may use this entrance <u>after 3:10 p.m.</u> for activities scheduled for after school hours. Students should not be dropped off or picked up on the EAST side of the school in the east parking lot as this is the Staff Parking Lot and can be dangerous due to the amount of traffic both before

Students being dropped off in the front of the school are to proceed <u>around the outside of the building</u> to the playground area west of the school upon their arrival unless they are participating in our breakfast program.

At the end of the school day, students who do not ride the bus will exit out the front of the building unless they live directly to the west of the school. In that case, students may exit out the door they enter in the morning.

For safety's sake, students are to be picked up along the sidewalk immediately in front of Parkview on Willard Drive unless you made arrangements to pick up your son or daughter at a different location. It is asked that no vehicles be left unattended while waiting to pick up students in this area because it totally disrupts the traffic flow.

Students who are walking from home or to home must cross only at crosswalks following the directions of the Safety Patrol and Village Crossing Guards.

We appreciate everyone's diligence in following these instructions in order to keep our students safe and allow for the dropping off of students to be as efficient as possible.


