



As part of the state accountability system, the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) produces report cards for every publicly funded school and district in Wisconsin. Each public school and district earns a "score" from 0 to 100 that is called an **accountability index score**. It is important to know that the 0 to 100 accountability index score is a not a percent correct measurement and is not similar to what you child might earn on a test in school.

The **accountability index score** that our school receives is based on our performance in four priority areas:

- Student achievement in reading and mathematics on state assessments.
- Student growth, measured by year-to-year improvements in achievement.
- Closing gaps in performance between specific student groups (comparing English language learners, low-income students, students with disabilities, and members of racial or ethnic group with their peers).
- On-track to graduation/postsecondary readiness, using reliable predictors of high school graduation and postsecondary success.

A school or district's **Overall Accountability Score** places the school/district into one of five Overall Accountability Ratings:

Overall Accountability Ratings	Score
Significantly Exceeds Expectations	83-100 ★★★★★
Exceeds Expectations	73-82.9 ★★★★☆
Meets Expectations	63-72.9 ★★★☆☆
Meets Few Expectations	53-62.9 ★★☆☆☆
Fails to Meet Expectations	0-52.9 ★☆☆☆☆

On November 13th the state of Wisconsin publically released all district and school report cards. Here are the Ashwaubenon District and High School Results:

In addition to the report cards publicly available online, we receive a secure report card to help us in our data-driven planning and continuous improvement efforts.
