- I. **Superintendent's Report**
- **Summer School:** Summer School 2024 has been a huge success. We had over 1,300 students participate in summer school. Great work by our staff, volunteers and of course our summer school leaders: Brian Carter, Michael Heim, Jason Fisch, Kris Hucek, Cassie Schneider, and Nick Senger. Thanks to Stacie Schabow and her team, we are extending summer school by providing additional support in the areas of literacy and math at Valley View Elementary over the next three weeks.
 - **Thea Kral Recognition:** The accolades continue for Thea Kral. Thea was announced as the 2023-24 Gatorade Wisconsin Girls Track & Field Player of the Year. Thea is the first Gatorade Wisconsin Girls Track & Field Player of the Year to be chosen from AHS. Congratulations Thea, we are so proud of you!

J. Discussion/Presentation Items:

1. **AHS Athletic Hall of Fame Update:** Senger provided an update on the newly developed AHS Athletic Hall of Fame. He shared a list of committee members and the 16 inaugural members from 1965 to 2000. Inductees and their families will be recognized at a Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony on August 29th and at the halftime of the August 30th football game. Inductees will be posted on the digital display located in the Fieldhouse entrance. Nominations are accepted for the next round of inductees. Nomination criteria and forms can be found on the high school's website.

K. Action Items:

1. **Bylaw and Policy Updates - second read:** Weyers presented policies 2105 and 5430 for a second read and approval. No additional changes were recommended. Moved Anderson, seconded by VanDeKreeke to approve the second and updates to policies 2105 and 5430 as presented. Aye 5 (Vyskocil, Garrigan, VandeWalle, Anderson, VanDeKreeke), Nay 0. Motion carried 5:0.
2. **Title IX Policy - first read/approval:** Weyers and Nicholson presented board policy 2264 regarding the new 2024 Title IX regulations. This policy is required to be adopted by school boards in order to receive federal funding. This policy needs to be in place by August 1, 2024. Cases that took place prior to August 1, 2024 will be reviewed and handled under policy 2266. Cases that take place after August 1, 2024 will be reviewed and handled under policy 2264. It is being recommended the board waive the second reading and approve the policy as presented. Moved Anderson, seconded by Garrigan to waive the second reading and approve policy 2264 as presented. Aye 4 (Vyskocil, Garrigan, VandeWalle, Anderson), Nay 1 (VanDeKreeke). Motion carried 4:1.
3. **Standards used to guide learning in the district:** Bake presented the Standards used in Curriculum Work by the Ashwaubenon School District. Board approval in July of these standards is a yearly requirement. There are no changes being recommended. Bake noted the standards that are currently under review by DPI. Moved by Garrigan, seconded by VanDeKreeke to approve the standards used to guide learning in the district as presented. Aye 5 (Vyskocil, Garrigan, VandeWalle, Anderson, VanDeKreeke), Nay 0. Motion carried 5:0.
4. **Resolution Authorizing A One-Year Taxable Tax and Revenue Anticipation Revolving Line of Credit For Cash Flow Purposes In An Amount Not To Exceed \$9,000,000:** Lucius reminded the board that they are asked yearly in July to approve a line of credit. This line of credit is used to cover expenditures until tax revenue and State Aid is received. A \$9,000,000 line of credit is being sought through Bank First, with a fixed interest rate of 6.75%. Money is only borrowed when needed and repaid when tax revenue or State Aid is received. Moved by Garrigan, seconded by Anderson to approve the Resolution Authorizing A One-Year Taxable Tax and Revenue Anticipation Revolving Line of Credit For Cash Flow Purposes In An Amount Not To Exceed \$9,000,000 as presented. Aye 5 (Vyskocil, Garrigan, VandeWalle, Anderson, VanDeKreeke), Nay 0. Motion carried 5:0.
5. **Transfer to Fund 46:** Lucius reminded the board the Fund 46 works as a savings account for building maintenance projects. Money in this fund can only be used for facility projects. The monthly budget forecast shows a surplus of \$1.2 million for 2023-24. Lucius is recommending a transfer from this surplus into Fund 46 of \$1.1 million. He spoke about the amount transferred in 2023 and how this amount fluctuates from year to year depending on how much the district has available. Moved by Anderson, seconded by VandeWalle to authorize the transfer of \$1.1 million into Fund 46 effective June 30, 2024, as presented. Aye 5 (Vyskocil, Garrigan, VandeWalle, Anderson, VanDeKreeke), Nay 0. Motion carried 5:0.

Seclusion and restraint data for 2022-23 now available

MADISON – The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction [today published information](#) reported by Wisconsin public schools on incidents where seclusion and/or physical restraint was used during the 2022-23 school year.

Pursuant to [2019 Wisconsin Act 118](#), Wisconsin public schools submit a report containing information on the use of seclusion and restraint in schools to the DPI annually by Dec. 1. Though it is not a requirement, the DPI analyzes the reported data and works with schools as appropriate to identify root causes and provide additional supports and resources to limit these traumatic incidents.

“We want to help every student succeed in our schools, so we must make every effort to prevent the use of seclusion and restraint,” State Superintendent Dr. Jill Underly said. “We must remember each of these reported incidents represents a traumatic lived experience – both for a student and for school staff. As progress continues toward our goal of limiting these tactics, our schools need additional support to train and educate staff around trauma-informed practices to help address the unique behavioral needs of students.”

Statewide, schools in the 2022-23 school year reported 5,396 instances of seclusion and 6,366 instances where physical restraint was used – decreases of 8.7 percent and 8 percent from the 2021-22 school year, respectively. Among those instances, 1,868 students were involved in seclusion incidents, and 2,763 were involved in physical restraint instances. Data does not indicate whether incidents of seclusion and restraint occurred simultaneously. Students in elementary schools were involved in a higher percentage of instances of seclusion and/or physical restraint than other types of schools. In addition, students with individualized education programs (IEPs) were involved in instances at a higher rate than other students, comprising 80 percent of all seclusion incidents and 78 percent of all physical restraint incidents reported for the 2022-23 school year.

The 2022-23 school year is the fourth year this information has been compiled and reported to the DPI. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and some Wisconsin schools shifting from in-person instruction to virtual instruction, the DPI urges caution when considering how incident rates have changed over time.

5460 - **GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS**

It shall be the policy of the Board to acknowledge each student's successful completion of the instructional program appropriate to the achievement of District goals and objectives as well as personal proficiency by the awarding of a diploma at fitting graduation ceremonies.

A student must earn 28 credits, including the credit requirements set by State statute, to be eligible to receive a diploma, provided all other requirements as determined by the State and the Board are met. The Board requires the following credit requirements for a diploma:

English	4 credits
Mathematics	3 credits
Science	3 credits
Social Studies	3 credits
Health	0.5 credits
Physical Education	1.5 credits
Financial Literacy	0.5 credits
Electives	13 credits

In order to earn a high school diploma, a student must successfully complete a civics assessment in accordance with State statute.

~~A student must also have participated in curriculum relating to financial literacy in order to earn a diploma~~

In accordance with State law, a Board may not grant a high school diploma to any student unless, during the high school grades, the student has been enrolled in a class or has participated in an activity approved by the Board during each class period of each school day, or the student has been enrolled in an alternative education program (defined in 115.28(7)(e)1,

Wis. Stats.) or is participating in a Board-approved program that allows a student enrolled in the high school grades who has demonstrated a high level of maturity and personal responsibility to leave the school premises for up to one (1) class period each day if the student does not have a class scheduled during that class period.

~~A student must successfully complete the community service requirement in order to receive a high school diploma.~~

The Board may approve a course or courses in career and technical education that it determines may satisfy up to a total of one (1) credit of mathematics and/or science credit.

The Board may waive graduation requirements, except for the core requirements, in exceptional cases to suit the needs of a student subject to Wis. Admin Code, §§ PI 18.03 and PI 18.04.

Graduation Credit as a Middle School Student

The Board permits students in 8th grade to earn credit towards a high school diploma in any class taken that is approved by the Board for such purpose, provided that the student is academically prepared based on performance on approved student assessments. Any course designated for high school credit at the middle school level must be taught by a teacher with high school certification in the subject matter and must be taught using curriculum and assessments equivalent to those used in the subject at the high school level.

Credit may be earned in any subject area meeting the requirements under this policy.

Courses taken by middle school students for high school credit shall appear on the students' high school transcript, along with the grade received however the grade and class may not be factored into the students' high school grade point average.

The Board directs the Superintendent to develop appropriate courses after determining annually whether sufficient student interest and appropriate staffing justifies offering such course(s). The Superintendent shall establish procedures to determine whether a middle school student is academically prepared to take any course approved for high school credit.

Additional Diploma Options

Board resolution adopted September 14, 2022, permits students to earn credit by demonstrating competency. If a student meets the criteria established, the course will be listed on the student's high school transcript and be used to meet the requirements for high school graduation.

The Superintendent shall develop procedures for how students may qualify for credit under this process.

The Board authorizes the Superintendent to establish an alternative diploma program for students who meet the requirements of State law but not the additional elective credit requirements established for attainment of a regular high school diploma from the District. An alternative education program is defined as an instructional program, approved by the Board, that utilizes successful alternative or adaptive school structures and teaching techniques and that is incorporated into existing, traditional classrooms, or regularly scheduled curricular programs or that is offered in place of regularly scheduled curricular programs. "Alternative educational program" does not include a private school or a home-based private educational program. (See Policy 2451 - Program or Curriculum Modifications)

The IEP team and any other necessary members will review the student's academic progress and the alternative achievement standards for graduation criteria.

Students With Disabilities

Students with disabilities who properly complete the programs specified in their I.E.P. and have received the recommendation of the I.E.P. Committee may participate in graduation activities and may be awarded a diploma (provided the student satisfied the District's high school graduation requirements) (see Policy 5460.01 - Diploma Deferral).

Graduation Activities and Ceremony

A student may be denied participation in graduation activities for disciplinary reasons and/or for non-payment of fees. The Superintendent and high school principal may establish additional requirements for participation in the graduation activities and may organize said activities to have the appearance and decorum deemed reflective of the District.

Policy Reporting and Review

The principal of the high school shall prepare a report describing the District's policies on high school graduation standards, including a list of courses required under State law and the number of hours in each school term required to earn one (1) credit for those courses. Additionally, any change to the District's policies shall also be reported to the Department of Public Instruction or other appropriate agency after it has been approved by the Board and signed by the Board president, the Superintendent, and the principal.
