


What can you do to help your child stay on the path of positive behavior?

- Ask your child about how he or she followed the expectations to Be Kind, Be Safe, and Be Responsible at school.
- Model and acknowledge positive behaviors at home. As situations arise, discuss how your child can follow the expectations and make good decisions at home and at school.
- Sign and return all paperwork sent home from school.
- Make sure your child is ready every day. Ensure a good night's sleep.
- Practice positive phrases with your child such as “thank you,” “please,” “excuse me,” and “I’m sorry.”
- Participate in school events and get involved! Collaborate with your child’s teachers, volunteer in the classroom, come to events, or chaperone a field trip.





What is PBIS?

Through the use of Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS), Cormier is committed to ensuring that students are kind, safe, and responsible while at school and that Cormier provides a positive learning environment. To achieve this goal, our staff is focused on teaching and acknowledging positive behavior for ALL students in ALL areas of the building. PBIS is a proactive, systematic approach in preventing and responding to classroom and school discipline issues. Our emphasis is on developing and maintaining a safe environment where teachers can teach and students can learn.

Behavioral Expectations

What it means to be kind, safe, and responsible at Cormier is outlined in our behavior matrix, which is located in the student handbook and on our website. Reminders of these expectations are posted throughout the school on posters so that students have frequent reminders. Kind, safe, and responsible behaviors are expected in all settings, including the playground, hallway, cafeteria, bathroom, and bus.

Cool Tools (Skills Teaching)

Cool Tools (lessons about behavioral expectations) are taught in large group, small group, or individual settings throughout the year. All school staff can teach these lessons. All Cormier students participate in a kick-off event over the first two days of school, which involve using our cool tools.

Acknowledgement

One of the components of Be Kind, Be Safe, Be Responsible is to recognize students for their positive behavior. Students will receive a Bee sticker when they are caught being kind, safe, or responsible. As a school, we will have special recognitions throughout the school year to continue to promote being Kind, Safe, and Responsible.



Behavior Referrals

Students who do not meet behavioral expectations will have additional reteaching of positive behavior skills. Additional interventions may be used such as involvement of administration or our school social worker.
